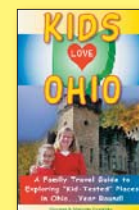


How do you Find Fun Exploring Ohio?

- The largest crystal geode is in Ohio.
- There's even a series of caves where Daniel Boone and the Shawnee once trod.
